GUEST SPEAKER: Carol J. Sulcoski, Knitwear Author, Instructor and Designer



Carol is an attorney, knitting author, teacher, and designer who has been working in the knitting industry for over a decade. She has taught classes at national shows like Vogue Knitting Live and Virtual Vogue Knitting Live, as well as at guilds, retreats, and knitting shops. Her designs have been featured in *Vogue Knitting, Noro Magazine, Interweave Knits* and other magazines and books.

Her latest book is *Yarn Substitution Made Easy* (Sterling/Lark 2019); her other books include *Self-Striping Yarn Studio*, *Sock Yarn Studio* and *Knitting Socks with Handpainted Yarn*. Carol's *Knitting Ephemera* is an entertaining book with anecdotes and tidbits about knitting, with over 300 bizarre facts such as the "102 activities that use FEWER CALORIES per hour than KNITTING." Her inspiration for this delightful book came from her late father, who was a proponent of education and mental creativity.

She lives outside Philadelphia with her three children and a fluffy orange cat, spending endless hours divided between two work shifts – her day shift as an attorney and her night shift as a creative and energized knitwear enthusiast.

PRESENTATION: The Use of Self-Striping Yarn

Carol will provide thoughtful technical information for knitting with self-striping yarns. Her focus and information will come from her "Studio" series books from Lark Crafts, including: *Lace Yarn Studio, Self-Striping Yarn Studio* and *Sock Yarn Studio*. Carol will raffle off two of her books: *Yarn Substitution Made Easy* and *Knitting Ephemera*.

VIRTUAL KNITTING PROJECT HELP SESSION

Following Carol's presentation, our luxury yarn raffle and Show and Tell, BAKG member **Susan Leibowitz** will host a **separate** Zoom session to help you get started if you are a beginner, or to assist you with an issue you're facing in your project. In this 45-minute virtual session, which is limited to 5 participants, Susan can help you develop a new skill, interpret a pattern, or fix an error. Participants will leave the BAKG Zoom meeting and log onto Susan's Zoom meeting. Here's what you need to do to **register** for the session:

- 2. Also, **by September 23**, you must email Susan with the following information: your issue, clear photos of your work, including close-ups of the right and wrong sides, and a clear picture of the pattern and designer name.
- 3. Confirmation of your participation, as well as the link to Susan's Zoom meeting, will come from Susan.
